

2017 4-H Chick Chain Project

How does the 4-H Chick Chain Project work?

- Select two different breeds of chicks to raise. You'll get six chicks of each breed = 12 chicks
- The breeds you can select from include:
 - Americauna (Easter Egger)
 - Barred Rocks
 - Black Australorp
 - Buff Orpington
 - Light Brahma (quantities are limited)
 - Rhode Island Red
 - White Leghorn
- In March, You will pick up your 12, 1-2 day old chicks from your county specified site.
- You'll raise and care for your chicks for about 21 weeks; within this time, you'll complete a 4-H project book and attend a workshop that will help you learn more about raising, showing, and selling your chickens.
- You'll participate in a show and showmanship contest with your best three pullets from one breed.
- An auction will be held for anyone interested in selling some or all of their hens, but participation in the auction is optional, and not a requirement for this project. Registration for the auction will be separate and come later on in your Chick Chain Project. Once registered for the auction, there will be a \$15 penalty fee to drop out of the auction. After a certain deadline, youth will not be permitted to drop out of or sign up for the auction.

What do youth learn by participating in the 4-H Chick Chain Project?

- Poultry nutrition and care to produce healthy chickens
- Communication skills
- Basic business practices
- Record keeping skills

How can I participate?

- 1. You must be or become a 4-H member in your county and be at least 5 years old as of September 1st.
- 2. Complete the registration form. Take it and your \$50 fee to your 4-H Agent.
- 3. Attend the mandatory youth/parent or guardian meeting.
- 4. Pick up your chicks.
- 5. Participate in the Poultry Perfection Care and Showmanship Workshop.
- 6. Participate in the 4-H show and showmanship.
- 7. Families may share one project between youth.
- 8. Each youth must complete their own record book and will participate in the show and showmanship separately.
- 9. If you participated in the 4-H Chick Chain the previous year, you may participate in the show and showmanship production class with three birds of the same breed
