The Jackson County Cattleman's Association is sponsoring two educational Animal Science Clinics that will be centered on show calf health (vaccinations and de-wormer will be available), nutrition, showmanship and record keeping.

The first clinic will be held on September 12, 2015 beginning at 8:30 AM at the Jackson County Ag Center on Highway 90, Marianna. The focus of this clinic will be animal health and nutrition. Those animals having not been previously vaccinated, may receive respiratory and/or blackleg vaccinations.

The second clinic will be held on September 26, 2015 at 8:30 AM at the Jackson County Ag Center on Highway 90, Marianna. The focus of this clinic will be a continuation of animal health including booster vaccinations or first vaccinations, to prevent animal loss from exposure to disease and/or stress during the show season.

Vaccines will be provided free of charge, compliments of Billy Arrighi, our Zoetis representative.

Dr. Kim George will be present at 8:30 am, September 26th to write and donate Health Papers to exhibitors. This date will be the official steer weigh-in for the 2016 Fed Cattle Show.
