Fair Days Ahead: Sarasota County Fair, March 14—23, 2014

You Need To Know... All exhibitors are required to work a shift(s) in ALL buildings / barns that they are exhibiting in. Parents will be responsible for providing adult supervision during these shifts. Please review your 2014 Sarasota County Fair Rule Book for complete guidelines.

Large Animal Barn shifts: beginning Saturday, February 22 through Tuesday, March 4 call Christina Schook at 915-2366 to schedule your large animal barn work shift. ALL exhibitors showing a large animal are required to work a shift. If you do not call by March 4 a work shift will be assigned to you.

Locker Assignments: Locker assignments will be given out by club. Christina Schook will be contacting club leaders with this information.

Mini Building Sign-up: If you have a project in the Mini Building you must sign up for a work shift. Two youth and one adult are needed for each shift. Please contact the 4-H Office at 861-9810 to schedule your shift beginning Wednesday, February 5.

Small Animal Tent: Rabbit, Poultry and Cavy Barn; Please contact Janie at her e-mail: jbesselm@scgov.net after February 10th or call 861-9874 on Monday, afternoon or Thursday only; 907-0011 on other days of the work week. Please leave a message.

Plant tent: your work shift will be on Saturday, March 22 during the Plant Show and Sale auction... you will be responsible for watering and caring for your plants during the fair.

Dog exhibitors will be receiving your work duties from your division coordinator.

Miniature Horse and Llama Exhibitors are required to work on Volunteer Work Day Saturday, March 8; at 8:00 AM.

Leaders: now is the time to volunteer your club for a shift in the Elephant Ear Booth! To sign-up call the 4-H Office at 861-9810, or sign-up at the next leaders meeting. The Foundation asks again this year, that you

- 5. Poultry judging will be conducted on Saturday, March 15th at 8:00 am with Poultry Showmanship to follow right after the animals are judged. If you are entering this contest, you must be in proper attire i.e. 4-H in white shirts and black pants/skirt; FFA in full uniform with your jacket.
- 6. Rabbit/Cavy Skill-a-thon Contest will be held on Sunday, March 16 at 2:00 pm at the PT Houser Show Arena**Note: this is where the 4-H or FFA student is tested on their knowledge of rabbit/cavies. If you have not picked up the Rabbit Skill-a-thon study guide, contact Janie Besselman for a copy of the guide at: jbesselm@scqov.net
- 7. Exhibit Removal is scheduled for Sunday, March 23 at 8:00 am. Please bring all your cages to remove your animals from the Small Animal Tent. We will need help from exhibitors and their families to take down and stack cages at this time.

Attention Swine Exhibitors:

All swine must be bled and tested for pseudo rabies and brucellosis by a certified veterinarian no more than 30 days before the FINAL ENTRY to the fair to be eligible for the fair.

The Livestock Committee will help facilitate the process by having a veterinarian at the Farm Bureau; 7289 Palmer Blvd. on Monday, February 17, 2014 at 5:00—7:00 pm. There will be a charge of about—\$10.00 for the test. You must contact Don Strickland at 371-1771 for a scheduled time.

If you choose to have your veterinarian do the test, it is your responsibility to have the paper work at the fair office. Time must be allowed for results to be certified and received by Fair office. Failure to have the blood test will result in disqualification from the fair.

Let's Get Ready for the Show!

All Exhibitors must wear appropriate 4-H attire when showing or selling animals and /or plants.

4-H = Black or white pants, solid white shirt or blouse with collar. Dark, closed-toe foot ware. <u>Optional</u>; 4-H emblem on shirt, tie (4-H colors), 4-H jacket

Preferred: Black pants, solid white shirt or blouse with collar, 4-H jacket (zipped)

Dairy Exhibitors: Solid white shirt or blouse with collar, solid white pants

No hats, flip-flops, sandals, or tobacco products allowed.

Closed-toe shoes or boots are required to be worn in the Barn Complex at all times. THIS RULE APPLIES TO ALL SCHUDULED WORK SHIFTS ALSO.

Here's the Scoop on Fair Passes...



The 4-H Office will distribute Exhibitor Fair Passes and Photo ID's Monday, March 3 through Tuesday, March 11, at **Twin Lakes Park**. On Wednesday, March 12 we will have the passes at Mini-

Building check-in at the **Fairgrounds**. After that - we will return unclaimed passes to the Fair Office.

Youth exhibiting livestock will receive their "photo ID".

Youth exhibiting Miniature Horses, Llama, Dog, Mini-Building, and Small Animal Barn will be receiving an "exhibitor pass".

All 4-H members, with projects entered in the fair, will be eligible to receive one exhibitor pass / or photo ID and two parent passes. Families with more than one member exhibiting projects in the fair will only receive two parent passes. The 4-H Office receives fair passes based on the number of exhibitors in the Fair. Sorry, we cannot accommodate requests for additional passes.

Important "PASS GATE" Information...

There has been a change in the "Pass Gate 2" for entrance/exit during Fair public hours at the Sarasota County Fair.

Gate 2 (which is the normal entry / exist pass gate between the fair office and the Ken Clark Building) will be closed <u>during Fair public hours</u>. It will be open prior to fair, as normal, for exhibitors, parents and leaders. Of course - you will still need your exhibitor pass or ID card to enter.

<u>During Fair public hours</u>: enter thru Gate 1 (by the Potter building), Gate 3 (by Robarts Arena) or Gate 4 (behind/east Robarts Arena).

Please make note of this important information so you are not late for work-shifts, shows, or contests.

Mini Building guestions answered!

The 4-H office will distribute Mini Building Entry Tags with Fair passes Monday, March 3 through Tuesday, March 11, at **Twin Lakes Park**. The 4-H office hours: 7:30 am—5:00 pm.

Mini building check-in is Wednesday, March 12, 3:00 PM - 7:00 PM. Please make sure your tags are filled out completely and attached securely to each item. This will eliminate delays at check-in. Remember: you must turn in your completed recorded book at check-in. Entries will not be accepted without your record book! Don't forget to sign-up for your work shift in the Mini-Building—call 861-9810.

Mandatory Removal of Mini-Building Entries:

All exhibitors are required to pick up your items on Sunday, March 23, 8:00 am. Items are not the responsibility of the 4-H office and will not be taken to the 4-H Office. After all items and decorations are removed, we will distribute Mini-Building premiums.

YOU Need To Know...



4-H County Events Day; February 8 Showtime is just around the corner!

Are you ready? Sarasota County Demonstrations and Public Speaking Event is Saturday, February 8, 2014 and will be held at the "Bayside Community Church": 8893 Fruitville Road (3 miles east of I-75). All those who turned in entry forms will receive a letter of confirmation and a scheduled time for your activity. Please check your confirmation carefully to make sure all the information is correct.

What happens after County Events? Each county may register all blue qualifying junior, intermediate, and senior individuals and all blue qualifying junior, intermediate, and senior teams for District Events. Counties also reserve the option of working with red placing entries, to improve the entry to a blue level, and qualify the entry for District Events. You can only enter 1 demonstration / or 1 public speech.

This year Pinellas County will host District Events on May 3, 2014. Juniors and Intermediates receiving "First—Blue" in their category at District Events will receive a full scholarship to Camp Cloverleaf (June 23—27). All District blue qualifying senior individuals and all blue qualifying senior teams may advance to State Events. Participants must meet a blue standard at District Events to qualify for state. State Events will be held at 4-H University, in Gainesville, July 28—August 1, 2014.

February is Heart Health Month...

Heart disease is the No. 1 killer of Americans.

We can reduce heart disease by promoting a healthy diet and lifestyle. For the first time the American Heart Association has defined what it means to have "ideal cardiovascular health" by identifying seven health and behavior factors that impact the quality of life. We know that even simple, small changes can make a big difference in living a better! Known as "Life's Simple 7," these steps can help add years to your life: 1. don't smoke 2. maintain a healthy weight 3. engage in regular physical activity 4. eat a healthy diet 5. manage blood pressure 6. take charge of cholesterol and 7. keep blood sugar, or glucose, at healthy levels. Make the change to a healthier YOU.

High Blood Pressure: Check It Out!

Myth. I feel fine. I don't have to worry about high blood pressure. More than 76 million U.S. adults have high blood pressure and many of them don't know it or don't experience typical symptoms. High blood pressure is serious. If uncontrolled, high blood pressure can lead to severe health problems. High blood pressure is also the No. 1 cause of stroke—get checked!


