2013 Youth Ocean Conservation Summit

Attention Steer Exhibitors...

The first steer weigh-in will be held at the Sarasota County Fair Grounds on: Saturday, September 7, 7:00–9:00AM. Exhibitors must be present at the initial and final weigh-in unless excused with prior approval.

Exhibitors: you are responsible to bring:

1. **Steer Entry Form** (page 51, Sarasota Fair Rulebook),
2. **Bill of Sale** (page 48, Sarasota Fair Rulebook), if you received a receipt / bill of sale from the seller; transfer the information to the form found in the fair rulebook and attach the original document.
3. **Entry fee: \$10.00.**
4. **"2013 Revised" Steer Project record book** (all required signatures on front cover and page 2)
5. **Livestock Housing Agreement** this form is required **ONLY** if your animal is not kept at your home / property.

**Please have all your paper work completed,
with all required signatures!**

Plant Entry Forms—Plant show and sale entry **form "A" only**, are due on Friday, October 4, by 5:00 pm at the **FAIR OFFICE** with entry fee - they will not accept late entries! Form "B" (classes 41 & 42) are due January 31.

NEED PLANT HELP? All 4-H youth are invited to attend a "plant clinic" on **Saturday, October 26** from 9:00 am-12 noon at Drymon's Nursery, 3146 47th Street (Lockwood & 47th). Pots, fertilizer and soil will be provided. Don't miss this!!!

A Plant Screening — will be conducted by members of the Florida Nursery Growers Association, on Saturday, **November 2** from 9:00 am - 12 noon at the Fairgrounds (Potter Building Parking lot). Plants will be checked and identified, record books **MUST BE** up-to-date. All exhibitors must be present with their plants and record book—**attendance is mandatory.**

Please note: Each exhibitor is eligible to enter and sell in a maximum of **TWO LOTS** in any **ONE CLASS**, not to exceed a **TOTAL** number of six (6) lots, **FOR A FINAL TOTAL OF ACTUAL INDIVIDUAL CONTAINERS OF PLANTS TO NOT EXCEED TEN (10) MAXIMUM.**

THE NUMBER OF ENTRIES FROM ANY LOTS AND SETS WITHIN...FROM PART A FORM + PART B FORM... MUST NOT EXCEED MORE THAN TEN (10) INDIVIDUAL CONTAINERS OF PLANTS.

Welcome New 4-H Leaders!

If you are planning a trip you wouldn't just start driving, hoping you're going in the right direction and have everything you need. A successful trip takes advanced planning. The same thing can be said for a 4-H Club. Planning a yearly program is essential to good monthly meetings.

"A club that fails to plan, plans to fail." Who should do the planning? A committee of 4-H members and leaders - usually the new officers, the organizational leaders and project / activity leaders.

At Your Planning Meeting:

- Adopt goals and suggest ways to reach them.
- Suggest ways to improve past programs.
- Decide when and where meetings will be held each month - a regular meeting place needs to be established.
- Make a tentative program outline for each meeting.
- Make tentative plans for other club activities.
- Give every member some responsibility during the year, such as giving a demonstration or project talk at the meeting, serving on committees, etc.
- Help junior leaders (if applicable) define their responsibilities - such as working with Cloverbuds, or younger new members,
- Provide each club family with a copy of the yearly program - VERY IMPORTANT!

Community Pride, A Florida 4-H Citizenship Activity

Each year many of our 4-H Clubs give so much to our community through service projects. Why not take the next step... The **4-H Community Pride Program** is designed to give 4-Hers' a better understanding of their community and encourage members to improve the quality of their environment, to plan and work as a team, and put that plan into action!

Youth will:

1. Learn about and understand their community and the impact it has on their lives.
2. Know how to relate, individually and through group cooperation, in order to work effectively in community activities, programs, organizations.
3. Develop skills and knowledge in community leadership.
4. Gain experience in carrying out community projects to improve their environment.
5. Develop an interest in and love for their community.

First step: As a club decide; the need, concern, or problem you would like to improve in your community.

Second: Plan out your project (what will it take; materials, supplies, and how much will it cost), complete and submit a "Community Pride Proposal" to the 4-H Office by **October 25**. A step-by-step guide can be found in the "Florida 4-H Community Pride Leaders Guide". Your proposal will be forwarded to the Florida 4-H State 4-H Office for review, and your club will be notified if it is chosen to receive a "Community Pride Grant".


Third: After completion of your project submit a "Community Pride Report" by June 1 for State judging.

Something to grow on...



Vegetable gardening offers fresh air, sunshine, exercise, enjoyment, mental therapy, and of course - nutritious fresh vegetables! The best way to start a garden is to have a plan: choose a place (remember: rows that run north to south allow plants to get the most sunlight as the sun travels its east to west path), draw a plan, and make a list of the vegetables you want to grow. September is a good time to start some vegetables like: beans, broccoli, sweet corn, cucumbers, lettuce, onions, peas, peppers, potatoes, and tomatoes.

Just as sunshine is important so is soil. Do the "squeeze test", you can test a handful of your soil by squeezing it lightly. If it feels gritty and falls apart when you open your hand, it's too sandy. If it feels muddy when it's wet or caked when it's dry, the soil has too much clay. The very best type of soil is in between; it feels crumbly - but wont fall apart when you squeeze it in a ball. Adding an organic material, such as compost, can help both sandy and clay soils.

You can garden just about anywhere—you don't need to live in the country or have a big yard to be a gardener. If you don't have a place to plant a garden in the ground, use containers! You can grown things in planter boxes, windowsill boxes, pots, wooden barrels, bushel baskets, tubs, empty milk container—just about anything you can think of.

Try this - The Three Sisters

Corn, squash and pole beans are vegetable friends! Native Americans planted these vegetables together in a mound. Corn provides support for the pole beans and it also provides a windbreak and shade for the squash. Beans provide a nutrient (nitrogen) for the corn. Squash keeps the corn roots cool. It also helps to keep raiding raccoons away from the corn - they don't like to step on the prickly leaves.

Just for FUN—Super-sized Pumpkin!

One of the most fun things to grow in your garden is a pumpkin. Super-sizing it is even more exciting. To grow a super-sized pumpkin it's best to use the kind of seeds that will produce an extra-large pumpkin. When your pumpkin is about the size of a softball—write your name on it. You can write the names of other family or friends and they will be surprised when you give them their very own pumpkin at the end of growing season. Use a bell point pen to lightly break through the skin as you write your name. Watch your name grow large as the pumpkin grows! The markings callus over and become easy to read as your pumpkin matures.


What is the 4-H State Marine Ecology Event?


