

OUR REACH AND IMPACT

FNP provides free, evidence-based nutrition education classes for SNAP-eligible youth and adults. Participants learn skills related to shopping, cooking, and making healthy food and physical activity choices.

FNP also works with local partners to change the environments in which people make

decisions about nutrition and physical activity. These initiatives, called Policy, Systems, and Environmental changes (PSEs), aim to make the healthy choice the easy choice.

To help keep participants, partners, and staff safe during the pandemic, FNP is offering online options for nutrition education and partner training in 2021.
