General Rules

1. Exhibitor must be an active Collier County or Florida 4-H member in good standing. Entry forms and additional rulebooks can be obtained from the Collier County Extension office, 14700 Immokalee Road, Naples, Florida 34120. Any questions should be first asked to the club leader. If the club leader does not know the answers, then contact the Collier County Livestock Committee Chairperson.
2. Exhibitors must be at least eight (8) years old by September first of the year prior to the show dates to exhibit market animals. Exhibitors must be at least five (5) years old by September first of the year prior to the show dates to show a non- market animal. Cloverbuds may participate but they will not be judged.
3. An up to date record book shall accompany all animals when they are admitted to final weigh-in or check-in.
4. An exhibit sign for all market animals containing the exhibitors name, club, animal weight and breed, must be displayed on the pen or stall by 4:00 p.m. on the day following the final weigh-in.
5. Exhibitors may enter and show a total of six (6) non-market animals (rabbits, goats, and poultry). Exhibitors may enter one (1) large breeding animal. Exhibitors may enter one (1) market animal. All animals (excluding cloverbuds) must be owned/leased by the exhibitor 90 days prior to the show.
6. Each exhibitor for the market animals and large breeding animals (cattle) must provide their own shovels, rakes, and buckets. There will be an area for show boxes. All equipment should be labeled with the exhibitor's name.
7. Sale of market animals will take place on the Saturday of the show dates at 7:00 p.m. The Collier County 4-H Livestock Committee makes no guarantees for the prices paid for market animals. If due to illness, injury, or

unusual circumstances an exhibitor is unable to show an animal an alternate exhibitor that has shown the same type of animal before may show the animal with the permission of the Collier County 4-H Livestock board.

8. Buyer's thank you card should be presented to the Livestock Coordinator (addressed, unsealed and stamped) on the Sunday following the auction. Add-on thank you notes (addressed, unsealed, and stamped) must be presented to the Collier County 4-H Livestock Committee secretary, or someone appointed by the committee within 14 days of the club leaders receiving receipt of the lists. Letters not delivered by the 15th day will result in a \$100 deduction from the exhibitors check. Said funds will be donated back to the Collier County 4-H Livestock show. A completed record book must be turned in to club leaders by May of the show year.
9. All animals will follow state guidelines in effect as of the publishing date of this rulebook. Any modifications to the rules will be implemented the following year. On June 21, 2006 new rules went into effect and can be located in their entirety in the Florida Administrative Code Chapter 5C-4, Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition. Any exhibitor found in violation of Florida Administrative Code 5c-4 will be banned from showing the following year.
10. No steers, dairy, or beef-breeding cattle will be permitted with horns or scurs (no longer than 1"), unless approved by Livestock Committee prior to the show.
11. Exhibitor must show his/her own animal except on permission of the Collier County 4-H Livestock Show Committee Board of Directors. Exhibitors are expected to wear 4-H show clothing, black or dark blue jeans or skirt (if skirt is below the knees), white long sleeved collared shirt with no embellishments, bolo tie or bowtie, and black closed toe shoes (preferably boots). No hats are permitted during show however cowboy hats may be worn during the auction.
12. Use of tranquilizers or other forms of tampering is prohibited. Collier County 4-H Livestock Show Committee reserves the right to test an animal at any time. The laws set forth in Florida Administrative code 5C-4 shall be strictly construed.

13. Exhibitor must keep his/her animals, stall space, barn and all other areas pertinent thereto clean and neat as possible. Each exhibitor must provide a suitable feed container for the animals and clean water at all times. Pen cleaning will be Thursday- Friday from 3:00p.m. To 5:00 p.m. Saturday from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.
14. Exhibitor will be responsible for the care of his/her animal until it is removed from the area.
15. If exhibitor is showing a market animal the buyer's letters are to be sent out by December 15.
16. The exhibitor if showing a market animal, is responsible for purchasing a buyer's gift to be presented to the buyer at the auction.
17. All Exhibitors must check in with the barn person each day and check for any special announcements. If animal is not properly cared for the exhibitor may be asked to remove the animal from the premises.
18. There will be three showmanship divisions in each animal category according to the 4-H groups: Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
19. All exhibitors should report to the dessert table after the sale of their animal to help serve drinks and dessert to the buyers. Parents and volunteer help is needed and appreciated.
20. Each exhibitor will be responsible for assisting with setting up and dismantling the exhibit area on the days scheduled.
21. For the protection of everyone and the animals, no dogs other than for physical limitations will be allowed on the premises.
22. A final weigh-in committee will be chosen to officiate the final weigh-in of the market animals. The committee will be made up of a panel of members, one of which is extension staff, who do not have any immediate relationship with a 4-H market animal exhibitor. This committee's responsibility will be to weigh-in the animals, check animals weight, weight gain, exhibitor's record book and any other criteria the rulebook stated before the animal is allowed to enter and be shown.

23. Rules for club hogs –A 4-H group or a 4-H organization is allowed to have a market hog to auction off for a benefit of the club. All rules must be followed as with an individual exhibitor. An exhibitor must be chosen before the initial tagging and they must be available to show the hog on the show date. Club hogs are not eligible for the Grand or Reserve placement but the exhibitor may compete in showmanship for his age group.
24. Final interpretation and administration of all rules is vested in the Collier County 4-H Livestock show's Board of Directors.

Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition

1. All animals will follow the state guidelines in effect as of the publishing date of this rulebook. Any modifications to the rules will be implemented the following year. On June 21, 2006 new rules went into effect and can still be located in their entirety in the Florida Administrative Code Chapter 5C-4, Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition. Any exhibitor found in Violation of Florida Administrative Code 5C-4 will be banned from showing the following year.
2. Official certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) when required must be issued by Florida licensed and USDA- accredited veterinarians. FAC 5C-4.0015(1), The OCVI must state the breed, sex and registration number, and the official individual identification of each animal. FAC 5C-4.0017 (1) (a).
3. All animals that are entered for market are considered “market class” and will go directly from the show to the slaughter. FAC 5C-4.0015(8).
4. For the health of all animals entered in the 4-H Livestock show all animals will need an OCVI.
5. All animals entered in a market class must be inspected prior to acceptance at the exhibition. For the purposes of this show, the inspection will take place at the final weigh-in at Roberts Ranch. Any animal showing signs of illness or in noncompliance with animal tests and OCVI requirements will be turned away. FAC 5C-4.0017(4).

6. **Cattle**, Florida origin not in market class, must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to the exhibition. Florida origin cattle do not need a tuberculin test. Cattle 6 months of age or older must have evidence of a negative brucellosis test within 30 days prior to the date of exhibition unless it is a steer spayed heifers: and originated from a certified Brucellosis-Free Herd or a Brucellosis Class Free State. The OCVI must show the certified herd number and the date of the last herd certification test.
7. All swine must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to presentation for exhibition. FAC 5C-4.003(3).
8. Poultry entered for exhibition without an OCVI must be inspected and bled prior to entry. FAC FC-4.004(1)
9. Goats originating from Florida must have an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to the exhibition. There are no test requirements for meat goats or Florida-origin dairy goats. All goats entered for exhibition must have an official individual identification in accordance with the National Scrapie Eradication Uniform Methods and Rules. FAC 5C-4.005(1) (a) and FAC 5C-4.005(2) and FAC 5C-4.005(3) (c).
10. Electronic microchip implants must be accompanied by owner statement of ID numbers and chip manufacture or a Bill of Sale from the flock of origin stating the microchip number.
11. If you are entering an imported animal (Animals Not Originating from Florida) additional rules and testing will apply. Please contact the Collier County 4-H Livestock Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson to review the specific rules.
12. Sheep and Market Lamb are required to have a scrapie tag, tattoo or microchip in accordance with the National Scrapie Eradication Uniform Methods and Rules. If the sheep has a microchip the exhibitor must provide a chip reader. **All tattooed sheep and market lambs must provide a copy of their registration papers. Electronic microchip implants must be accompanied by owner statement of ID numbers and microchip manufacture or a Bill of Sale from the flock of origin stating the microchip number.**

Sale Rules

1. All market animals that made final weigh-in will be sold at auction and transported directly from the exhibition to the slaughter house. Under no circumstances, will an animal be sold at auction if said animal did not make final weight.
2. Exhibitor may sell only one (1) market animal per year in the Collier County 4-H Livestock Show.
3. Florida Administrative code 5C-4.0015 defines a market class as “An exhibition class consisting of finished fed animals that shall go directly to slaughter immediately following the exhibition.
4. Order of Sale: Grand Champion, Reserve Champion then the remaining in the order determined by the Collier County 4-H Livestock Board.
5. All sales proceeds are due at the time of the auction. Exhibitors, please inform your buyer (if sponsored) that payment is due at time of auction.

Breeding Sheep Show Rules

This is a Youth Show. We encourage each young person to accept the responsibility of his/her sheep project by handling their sheep themselves. If the youth is unable to do so another youth may assist demonstrating leadership and teamwork abilities.

1. All general rules set out on pages 4 through 6 apply to the exhibiting of breeding sheep.
2. All sheep entries must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. Only one sheep per exhibitor may be shown.
3. Please pick up your remark cards and ribbons at the end of the show before you leave. They will not be mailed.
4. This is a one day “tail-gate show”. No pens will be available. Please bring your own pens, crates, or leashes to restrain your sheep.
5. This is not a sanctioned show by any sheep organizations.
6. All Florida State Health rules and regulations will be applied. A health certificate is required. Animals with obvious signs of illness will be denied entry to participate or unload.
7. Sheep are required to have a scrapie tag, tattoo, or microchip. If sheep has a microchip the exhibitor must provide a chip reader. **All tattooed sheep must provide a copy of their registration papers.**
8. Sheep may be purebred or grade (mixed breed).

9. All breeds shall compete separately according to the following classifications:

Ram Classes

Ram Lambs
Rams, 2 tooth
Rams, 4 tooth & over

Ewe Classes

Ewe Lambs
Ewe 2 tooth
Ewe, 4 tooth & over

Sheep teeth develop in pairs for the first four years. Sheep less than one year old have eight small teeth. On or about their first birthday sheep will get two bigger permanent teeth. They get two more permanent teeth each year until their fourth birthday.

Guidelines for the Sheep Showmanship

Showmanship is a participant's opportunity to demonstrate his/her knowledge and ability to properly select and present sheep to their best advantage. The participant's confidence, ability and the sheep response are indicators of the knowledge and skills gained in handling and identifying quality animals, as well as defects, disqualifications, breed and variety characteristics.

When selecting your sheep for showmanship, you should check the sheep over thoroughly. The sheep should be free of diseases, parasites and disqualifications. If the participant is young or new to the sheep project, the judge may have to prompt some. Extra points may be given for thorough knowledge, or points may be deducted for missed areas of incorrect reasons.

Dairy & Beef Breeding Cattle Rules

1. All general rules set out on pages 4 through 6 apply to the exhibiting of dairy and beef breeding cattle.
2. Exhibitor may enter and show one animal. Each exhibitor is responsible for providing a removable feed container, water bucket and feed for the animal.
3. Entries are limited to one animal per class. Entry forms must be submitted to the Extension office by the third Friday of November.
4. Animals will be received for final weigh-in, if appropriate, and entry at the Roberts Ranch on Wednesday of the show week between the hours of 4:00 and 8:00 p.m.
5. Animal disposition- On Thursday of the show week at 5:00 p.m. the exhibitor and one parent must be present for a determination of the animal disposition.
 - The Board of Directors will appoint a special committee of qualified cattlemen to conduct a disposition test.
 - Exhibitor will be required to lead the animal into the show ring.
 - The exhibitor must be able to control their animal at all times.
 - If any member of the special committee observes a problem with an animal. He/she will approach the disposition committee and a decision will be made. If the animal is a threat to the safety of others the disposition committee will disqualify the animal and the exhibitor will be asked to remove the animal from the grounds.
6. Beef cattle may be purchased purebred or crossbred.
7. All animals showing in registered classes must have registration papers.

8. Dairy and beef classes may be exhibited and shown. Exhibitor must designate if showing a dairy or beef breeding at the time of entry.
9. All recognized breeds shall compete separately according to age classification.
10. All grade animals will be shown together in commercial classes according to age and classification.
 - Bulls over 4 months and under 1 year
 - Bulls over 1 year and under 2 years
 - Bulls over 2 years
 - Heifers over 4 months and under 1 year
 - Heifers over 1 year and under 2 years
 - Cows over 2 years
11. Nothing can be given to the animal except feed, hay and water. Under no circumstances may anyone give anything to calm the animal.
12. No drugs may be administered to the animals at the exhibition unless they are administered by a state certified veterinarian and/or staff of the veterinarian and the Collier County 4-H Livestock Committee Board of Directors are notified in advance.

General Goat Show Rules

This is a Youth Show. We encourage each young person to accept the responsibility of his/her goat project by handling their goat themselves. If the youth is unable to do so another youth may assist demonstrating leadership and teamwork abilities.

1. All general rules set out on pages 4 through 6 apply to the exhibiting of goats.
2. All goat entries must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or leased 90 days prior to show. Only one goat per exhibitor may be shown.
3. Please pick up remark cards and ribbons at the end of the show before you leave. They will not be mailed.
4. This is a one day “tail gate show”. No pens will be available. Please bring your own pens, crates, or leashes to restrain your goats.
5. This is not a sanctioned show by any goat organizations.
6. All Florida State health rules and regulations will be applied. A health certificate is required. Animals with obvious signs of illness will be denied entry to participate or unload.
7. Goats are required to have either a scrapie tag, tattoo or microchip. If the goat has a microchip the exhibitor must provide a chip reader. All tattooed goats must provide a copy of their registration papers. Electronic microchip implants must be accompanied by owner statement of ID numbers and chip manufacture or Bill of Sale from the flock of origin stating the microchip number.
8. Goats may be purebred or grade (mixed breed).

9. All breeds shall compete separately according to the following classifications:

- A. Dairy
- B. Meat
- C. Pygmy
- D. Nigerian Dwarf
- E. Southdowns
- F. Any other breed not mentioned
- G. Whethers (regardless of breed of goat)

If your goat has never been bred and is not producing milk, please do not register in the dairy class. No changes will be made at the time of show.

Grade goats should be entered in the breed they most resemble.

Guidelines for the Goat Showmanship

Showmanship is a participant's opportunity to demonstrate his/her knowledge and ability to properly select and present goats to their best advantage. The participant's confidence, ability and the goat's response are indicators of the knowledge and skills gained in handling and identifying quality animals, as well as defects, disqualifications, breed and variety characteristics.

When selecting your goat for showmanship, you should check the goat over thoroughly. The goat should be free of diseases, parasites and disqualifications. If the participant is young or new to the goat project, the judge may have to prompt some. Extra points may be given for thorough knowledge: or points may be deducted for missed areas or incorrect reasons.

Special Rules for Market Lamb

1. All general rules set out on page 4 through 6 apply to the exhibiting of market lambs.
2. All lambs must be a recognized breed.
3. Only wethers will be allowed to enter and show in the market lamb project. The wethers must be either wool breed or hair breed market lambs. Separate classes will be set for the hair breed and the wool lambs.
4. Market lambs will be weighed and tagged on the first Saturday in October, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. The site of the weigh-in will be announced. There is no minimum weight requirement for the initial weigh-in. Exhibitor must be present with completed official entry form and bill of sale.
5. Exhibitor must notify the Collier County 4-H Livestock Committee within 24 hours of an ear tag coming off or being lost. This is very important so that the committee may replace the ear tag.
6. Market lambs must weigh a minimum of 90 lbs. and a maximum of 140 lbs. at the final weigh-in on the Wednesday of the show and must be less than 15 months of age. Exhibitor must be present.
7. Market wool lambs must be slick shorn (no more than ½ inch of wool).
8. Lambs will be allowed to cross the scale one (1) time only unless the official weigh person deems it necessary to rebalance the scale and reweigh the animal. Lambs may not leave the immediate area during the rebalancing and weighing. The final weigh-in committee will check the weight, daily weight gain, record book and all other criteria before the animal will be allowed into the pen.
9. No replacement of lambs after initial weigh-in.
10. Each exhibitor is responsible for providing supplies and feed for animal.

General Poultry Show Rules

This is a youth show. We encourage each young person to accept the responsibility of his/her poultry project by placing his/her poultry on and off the judging table. If the youth is unable to do so another youth may assist demonstrating leadership and teamwork abilities. With the many activities of the day youth are reminded that it is important to remember that showing your poultry when it is called to the table is your main priority. Please try to participate in as many activities as you wish, but always be ready when your poultry is called to the table.

Late Entries: Entries may be changed the morning of the show as long as they are the same class, same sex, and same variety. All changes must be made before the show begins. No additional poultry entries will be accepted-No exceptions.

1. All general rules set out on pages 3 through 6 apply to the exhibiting of poultry
2. All poultry must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
3. Please pick up remark cards and ribbons at the end of the show before you leave. They will not be mailed to you.
4. Poultry will be called to the table three times only. If after the 3rd call, your poultry is still not on the table, it will be listed as a “no show”.
5. No exhibitor or spectator will be allowed in the judging area.
6. Any animal showing signs of disease or sickness will be removed from the showroom area and will not be accepted for judging.
7. The county 4-H Extension Agent, Veterinarian and/or a representative of the veterinarian’s office, Superintendents and Livestock health committee reserve the right to make any necessary changes.

8. There will be no changes after the judging begins.
9. No carriers will be allowed under judging tables at any time.
10. All Judge's decisions will be final.
11. This is a one-day carrier show – All carriers must have waterproof bottoms. Youth must provide food and water for their poultry. An area will be set aside for the youth to place their poultry in their carriers while the youth are participating in other events. All animals must be removed from the area by the evening of the show day.
12. If you are leaving the show early and you have a Best of Breed winner, please inform the show contact of Scratch. You must be present to compete in Best of Show.
13. The official rules and regulations may be changed only once per year at the first or second general meeting of the committee following the previous year's show.

General Rabbit & Cavy Show Rules

This is a youth show. We encourage each young person to accept the responsibility of his/her rabbit or cavy project by placing his/her rabbit's or cavies on and off the judging table. If youth is unable to do so another youth may assist demonstrating leadership and teamwork abilities. With the many activities of the day youth are reminded that it is important to remember that showing your rabbit or cavy when it is called to the table is your main priority. Please try to participate in as many activities as you wish, but always be ready when your rabbits or cavies are called to the table.

Late Entries: Entries may be changed the morning of the show as long as they are the same class, sex, and same variety. All changes must be made before the show begins. No additional/late entries will be accepted. No exceptions.

1. All general rules set out on pages 4 through 6 apply to the exhibiting of rabbits and cavy.
2. All rabbits and cavies must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and must be clearly tattooed in the ear or in the event of a cavy, tagging is permissible.
3. Please pick up remark cards and ribbons at the end of the show before you leave. They will not be mailed.
4. Rabbits and cavies will be called to the table three times only. If, after the 3rd call, your rabbit or cavy is still not on the table, it will be listed as a "no show".
5. No exhibitor or spectator will be allowed in the judging area.
6. Any animal showing signs of disease or sickness will be removed from the showroom area and will not be accepted for judging.

7. The County 4-H Extension Agent, veterinarian and/or a representative of the veterinarian's office, superintendents and Livestock Health Committee reserve the right to make any necessary changes.
8. There will be no changes after judging begins.
9. No carriers will be allowed under the judging tables at any time.
10. For this show there will be no meat pen entries.
11. All judge's decisions will be final.
12. This is a one-day carrier show- All carriers must have waterproof bottoms. Youth must provide food and water for their rabbits or cavies. An area will be set aside for the youth to place their animals in their carriers while the youth are participating in other events. All animals must be removed from the area by the evening of the show day.
13. If you are leaving the show early and you have a Best of Breed winner, please inform the show contact of Scratch. You must be present to compete in the Best of Show.
14. The official rules and regulations may be changed only once a year at the first or second general meeting of the committee following the previous year's show.

Guidelines for the Rabbit & Cavy Showmanship

Showmanship is a participant's opportunity to demonstrate his/her knowledge and ability to properly select and present rabbits and cavies to their best advantage. The participants confidence, ability and the rabbit's or cavies response are indicators of the knowledge and skills gained in handling and identifying quality animals, as well as defects, disqualifications, breed and variety characteristics.

When selecting your rabbit or cavy for showmanship, you should check the rabbit or cavy over thoroughly. The rabbit or cavy should be free of diseases, parasites and disqualifications. If the participant is young or new to the rabbit or cavy

project the judge may have to prompt some. Extra points may be given for through knowledge, or some points may be deducted for missed areas or incorrect reasons.

Special Rules for Steer

1. All general rules as set out on pages 4 through 6 apply to the exhibiting of steer.
2. Steer will be weighed, tattooed or tagged on the Saturday before the last Saturday in August at the location to be announced. Steer must weigh at least 550 lbs. at the first weigh-in. (note a 550 lb. steer will need to gain at least 2.0 lbs. per day to meet the final weight minimum of 850 lbs.) Exhibitor must be present with completed entry form and bill of sale.
3. Steer must be at least 850 lbs. not be over 2 years old, and have an average daily gain of 1.5 lbs. at the final weigh-in on Wednesday of the show week. Exhibitor must be present. Steer weighing over 1300 lbs. will be auctioned off at 1300 lbs.
4. Steer will be allowed to cross scale one (1) time only unless the official weigh-in person deems it necessary to rebalance the scale and reweigh the animal. Steer may not leave the immediate area during the rebalancing and weighing. The final weigh-in committee will check the weight, daily weight gain, record book and all other criteria before the animal will be allowed into the pen.
5. All animals must be tied and have a double safety tie rope (a neck rope and 1 nylon show halter) at all times. Exhibitors are responsible for providing feed containers, water buckets, and feed for the animal.
6. Animal screening- On Thursday of the show week at 5:00 p.m. the exhibitor and one parent must be present for a determination of the animal disposition.
 - The Board of Directors will appoint a special committee of qualified cattlemen to conduct a disposition test. Exhibitor will be required to lead the animal into the show ring.

- An exhibitor must be able to control their animal at all times.
 - If any member of the special committee observes a problem with an animal, he /she will approach the Disposition Committee and a decision will be made. If the animal is a threat to the safety of the others, the disposition committee will disqualify the animal and the exhibitor will be asked to remove the animal from the grounds.
7. Nothing can be given to the animal except feed, hay and water. Under no circumstances may anyone give anything to calm the animal.
 8. No drugs may be administered to the animals at the exhibition unless they are administered by a state certified veterinarian and/or staff of the veterinarian, and the Collier County 4-H Livestock Committee Board of Directors are notified in advance.
 9. Any substance that violates state or federal law found in any carcass will be the total responsibility of the owner for violating the law and the owner forfeits the right to the sale price of the animal.
 10. No replacement of steer after initial weigh-in.

Special Rules for Swine

1. All general rules as set out on pages 4 through 6 apply to the exhibiting of swine.
2. All swine must be a recognized domestic breed.
3. All entries must be limited to the market barrows and gilts.
4. Market swine will be tagged on the first Saturday of October from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at a specified area. There will be no initial weigh-in. Exhibitor must bring his swine to be tagged along with an entry form and a bill of sale. (Note: To make the market weight of 230 lbs. at the final weigh-in you should try to get a pig between 70 and 110 lbs.)
5. Collier County is a “No Swine” county with the exception of a 4-H hog for a limited time. The 4-H swine must be registered with the current 4-H Agent and rules and guidelines must be followed. To review these rules and guidelines contact your 4-H Agent.
6. Exhibitor must notify the Collier County 4-H Livestock committee within 24 hours of an ear tag coming off or being lost. This is very important so that the committee can replace the ear tag.
7. Market swine must weigh at least 230 lbs. at the final weigh-in on the Wednesday of the show week. Exhibitor must be present. Swine weighing over 300 lbs. will be auctioned at 300 lbs.
8. Swine will be allowed to cross the scale one (1) time unless the official weigh-in person deems it necessary to rebalance the scale and reweigh the animal. Swine may not leave the immediate area during the rebalancing and weighing. The final weigh-in committee will check the weight, record book and all other criteria before the animal will be allowed into the pen.
9. No replacement of swine after the initial tagging.

10. Each exhibitor is responsible for providing a removable feed container, and feed for animal

Identification of Swine

Fairs and Exhibitions

Federal regulations 9CFR.71.19 requires that all swine being shown at fairs or exhibitions (interstate Commerce) must have official individual identification. Swine presented that do not meet the federal official individual identification may not be allowed entrance into the show. The list of approved swine identification devices/methods includes:

- Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) ear tags
- National Uniform Ear tagging System (NUES)
- Ear Notching, if the ear notching has been recorded in the record of a purebred registry association, with registry association documentation accompanying animal.
- Ear or flank tattoo, for those recorded in the book of record of a swine registry association, with registry association documentation accompanying animal.

Changes to the State Exhibition Rule

F.A.C.5C-4

May 30, 2018

The following is a summary of changes to the Florida Exhibition Rule, F.A.C.5C-4. These changes are made at the request of industry and took place on July 1, 2018.

The changes include:

- The accepted time period for valid testing results on Florida origin breeding swine has been extended from 30 days to 90 days. The 90 day frame coincides with the length of the time the Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) is valid.
- Florida origin sheep and goats less than three months of age and accompanied by their dam are exempt from the OCVI requirement.

- Sheep and goats less than three months of age are exempt from the scrapie identification requirements.

Special Rules for Cloverbud Show

1. Cloverbuds must be 5 to 7 years old by September 1, of current year.
2. Cloverbuds must be a 4-H club member in good standing.
3. According to Florida 4-H guidelines, Cloverbuds are not allowed to compete but are allowed to do demonstrations.
4. Cloverbuds may enter one (1) animal as follows: Rabbit, Cavy, or Poultry. All health and OCVI rules must be followed as outlined in the general section of this rulebook. Cloverbud entries will be received on the show date.
5. Entry forms should be submitted to the Extension office by November 30th of the show year.
6. Cloverbuds may also demonstrate their animal at the Cloverbud Pet Show at 7:00 p.m. on the Saturday of the show. A demonstration would include telling about their animal. A poster display may be used.
7. Cloverbuds are not required to turn in a record book but are encouraged to do a simplified version to their club leader.

Florida 4-H rules do not allow participants 5-7 years of age to compete but they are welcome to observe and learn in preparation for junior classification.

In no case shall the Collier County Extension Office, Collier County Parks and Recreation, or any of its officers, or directors, agents, employees or volunteers be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury, or death by disease, theft or from any other cause of any character, to any property or person while same is at the show site or any other place. The Collier County Extension Office, Collier County Parks and Recreation, or any of its officers, or directors, agents, employees or volunteers assumes no responsibility for any property being brought and kept upon said grounds. Each exhibitor is responsible for the care, custody and control of his/her exhibit. However, every precaution will be taken to eliminate any danger in the showroom. Parents will be held responsible for all of their children's actions and property.

A special thanks is extended to the many volunteers and others for their role in making this year's show possible including our committee members, 4-H members and their families, donors, vendors, judges and of course our support staff at the County Extension office. Special thanks to the Roberts Ranch Museum for allowing us to hold our show at their facilities! Advance thanks to our "un-known" show day volunteers also!
