Counselor Responsibilities

- Attend <u>one</u> of the County trainings <u>OR</u> the multi-county training at Camp Timpoochee.
- Assume full responsibility for the safety and welfare of campers for entirety of camp.
- Ensure that all campers feel welcome, understand camp rules, and learn each of their names the first day. Create a sense of belonging and help campers feel welcome.
- Know where each camper is at all times.
- Attend activities with assigned group and support staff efforts by assisting as needed and/or directed. Participate in activities and be a good role model for campers.
- Set-up, prepare, lead/teach and/or assist with activities during scheduled times.
- Work cooperatively with your other cabin Counselor to carry out duties and supervise campers.
- Work with agents, camp staff, adult volunteers and other teen counselors to make the camp experience fun and exciting for every camper.
- Have fun and learn about leadership and responsibility through being a camp counselor.
