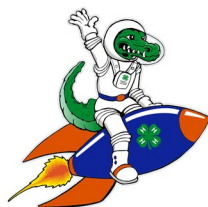

4-H County & District Events

Holmes County is preparing for the “4-H Get Your 4-H On” District Events (GY4HO) on June 1st and the deadline to participate is fast approaching. April 30, 2013! If you are interested in participating in the GY4HO event, you must participate in the *Holmes County 4-H Events* on April 30th to qualify. **Event Registration Forms are due in the Holmes County 4-H Office by April 12th and are available through the Holmes County 4-H Office.**

4-H is for all youth who like action, learning, and FUN!

4-H participation in County/District Events provides 4-Hers the chance to compete in a fun, friendly, and environment. There are so many different area to compete in: a science fair, photography, fashion, public speaking, etc...Every 4-Her should be able to find something that interests them at GY4HO. **Competitive events are an important part of any well-rounded 4-H Program, and serves to help youth develop poise, and self confidence.** These events also provide youth with the experience of developing and presenting public presentations, compete for awards and recognition, and to practice good sportsmanship. 4-H members ages 8-18 (as of September 1, 2012) are eligible to participate. Registration for the Holmes County 4-H County Events ends on April 12th. If we have enough entries (3 or more in each category) we will host *County Events* which is tentatively scheduled for April 30, 2013. From County Events, those youth placing 1st and 2nd place in each division are eligible to compete in GY4HO-District Events. So, as long as we have enough entries, we will host County Events this year! If we do not need a county elimination, the County Events date will be cancelled.
