

What is journaling?

"A way of making observations about a particular situation, that you may or may not be willing to discuss openly, that will help a person process what is going on in the project they are working on, or it can act as a reminder; a method of recording your experiences." (Anderson 2011)

Did you know that you are doing the work that a scientist does? You should look at your eggs every day and make notes on what you see. Your teacher will discuss with you what is happening each day as your chicks develop. One reason we keep notes about our observations is so that we can look back at our work and see where we might make improvements if something does not go right. Keeping good records is very important.
